## A Bill

A bill to prohibit the cloning of humans.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of
- 2 America in Congress assembled,
- 3 Section 1. Short Title.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Human Cloning Prohibition Act."
- 5 Section 2. Definitions.

6	1. In this Act the term human cloning means:
7	A. The use of somatic cell nuclear transfer or any other cloning technique for
8	the purpose of initiating or attempting to initiate a human pregnancy.
9	B. The implantation of a conceptus, blastocyst, or embryo created through
10	somatic cell nuclear transfer into a mammalian uterus.
11	C. The creation of genetically identical siblings by dividing a conceptus,
12	blastocyst, or embryo for the purpose of initiating or attempting to initiate
13	a human pregnancy.

1	2.	Egg. The term "egg" means a mature female germ cell of any species.	
2	3.	Oocyte. The term "oocyte" menas an immature female germ cell of any	
3		species.	
4	4.	Person. The term "person" includes any individual, partnership, firm, joint	
5		stock company, corporation, association, trust, estate, or other legal entity.	
6	5.	Somatic cell. The term "somatic cell" means any diploid cell of the human	
7		organism, including a cell of a conceptus, embryo, fetus, child, or adult, not	
8		existing as a haploid germ cell.	
9	6.	Somatic cell nuclear transfer. The term "somatic cell nuclear transfer" means	
10		transferring the nucleus of a human somatic cell into an oocyte or egg from	
11		which the nucleus has been removed or rendered inert.	
12	Section 3.	Prohibitions on Human Cloning.	
13	1.	It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in a human cloning procedure.	
14	2.	No federal funds may be obligated or expended to conduct or support any	
15		research the purpose of which is to engage in a human cloning procedure.	
16	Section 4. Enforcement.		
17	1.	Civil Penalties. Any person found to be in violation of section 3 shall be	
18		subject to a civil penalty of not more than \$10,000,000 for each such	
19		violation.	
20	2.	Ineligibility for Federal Funds. Any person found to be in violation of section	
21		3 shall not be eligible to receive any Federal funding for any research for a	
22		period of 15 years after such violation.	

1	3.	Criminal Penalty. Any person who is convicted of violating any provision of
2		section 3 shall be sentenced up to 10 years in prison.
3	Section 5.	Enactment Date.

4 1. This law shall take effect on January 1, 2002.
